Tobacco is threatening to become an uncontrollable epidemic with 13 lakh deaths every year due to tobacco related diseases. Economic burden (both direct and indirect) of tobacco use in India is estimated to Rs. 104,500 crores per year. In this context tobacco control programs aim to reduce disease, disability and death related to tobacco use. Against this backdrop MANT has been facilitating for establishment of effective and efficient system of tobacco control in the state of West Bengal.

MANT was invited to be present in the training programme and also facilitate the participants regarding Tobacco and Deafness interrelationships on 7th July, 2019, at Meeting Hall, Dy CMOH-II Office, Barasat, North 24 Parganas.
