

Sensitization Workshop on COTPA,2003 for the Police Officials of Murshidabad on 16.02.2018

Introduction:

Tobacco use continues to be the leading global cause of death and threatening to become an uncontrollable epidemic with 13 lakhs deaths every year due to Tobacco diseases. As a result Tobacco related mortality is increasing day by day. Economic burden (both Direct and Indirect) of Tobacco use India, is estimated Rs.1,04,500 crores per year. In this context Tobacco Control Programme aims to reduce diseases, disabilities and deaths related to tobacco use. In this perspective **MANT** is on the way towards establishment of an effective and efficient system of Tobacco Control in West Bengal.

Planning:

As per order of Deputy Inspector General of Police, CID, West Bengal to all SPs/SRPs/All CPs of all commissionerates of West Bengal Police, Regional Coordinator, MANT approached to Superintendent of Police, Murshidabad to organize Sensitization programme in regard to Cigarettes and other Tobacco products Act. 2003. After several interactions Superintendent of Police, Murshidabad finalized a date of Sensitization workshop on COTPA, 2003 for the Police Officials of Murshidabad on 16th February at 12.30 PM.

Focus:

The main focus of the programme was to orient and sensitize police officials of Murshidabad regarding the health & economic burden of tobacco use and about a comprehensive enforcement strategy through the implementation of **Cigarette and other Tobacco Product (Prohibition of Advertisement and Regulation of Trade and Commerce, Production, Supply and Distribution) Act, 2003** which can significantly reduce or eliminate the exposure to smoking.
