

**Sensitization Meeting on Advancing Tobacco Control with
Special emphasis on Capacity Building and Enforcement of COTPA, 2003 at
Administrative Training Institute, Kolkata on 19.01.18**

Introduction:

Tobacco use is considered to be the leading global cause of death and threatening to become an uncontrollable epidemic with 13 lakh deaths every year due to tobacco use, As a result tobacco related mortality is increasing other the years. Economic burden (both direct and indirect) of tobacco use in India, is estimated to Rs.1,04,500 crores per year.

Focus:

The main focus of the programme was to orient or sensitize the trainee WBCS (EXE.) Officers & other allied service officers regarding the burden of Tobacco use and about a comprehensive enforcement through the implementation of **Cigarette and other Tobacco Products (Prohibition of Advertisement and Regulation of Trade and Commerce, Production Supply and Distribution) Act 2003** which can significantly reduce and eliminate the exposure to passive



smoking. It is expected that these officials after training would be placed at various districts and would be able to enforce the law in their respective jurisdiction after this sensitization programme.

Planning:

The Project Coordinator approached to Ms Gargi Ghosh WBCS (Exe), Associate Professor Natural Disaster Management, ATI, Kolkata for conducting Sensitization Meeting on advancing Tobacco Control with special emphasis on capacity building and enforcement of COTPA, 2003 with WBCS (Exe) probationer officers of Administrative Training Institute. After several interactions, Course Coordinator, ATI finalized the date of sensitization meeting on 19th January, 2018 with the WBCS (Exe) probationer officers of Administrative Training Institute, Kolkata
