

**Sensitization Meeting on Advancing Tobacco Control with
Special emphasis on Capacity Building and Enforcement of COTPA, 2003
Gayeshpur Municipality on 28.02.2019**

Introduction:

Tobacco is threatening to become an uncontrollable epidemic with 13 lakh deaths every year due to tobacco related diseases. Economic burden (both direct and indirect) of tobacco use in India is estimated to Rs. 104,500 crores per year. In this context tobacco control programmes aim to reduce disease, disability and death related to tobacco use. Against this backdrop MANT has been facilitating for establishment of effective and efficient system of tobacco control in the state of West Bengal.

Planning:

Regional Coordinator approached the Chairman of Gayeshpur Municipality for conducting a sensitization programme with all the councillors and all Departmental Heads/In Charges of the Gayeshpur Municipality. After several conversations with Executive Officer a date was finalized for the sensitization programme on 28th February, 2019.

Focus:

The main focus of the programme was to orient and sensitize the Elected Councillors and other officials of Gayeshpur Municipality on the burden of tobacco use and need for a comprehensive enforcement mechanism through which the implementation of



Cigarette and other Tobacco Product (Prohibition of Advertisement and Regulation of Trade and Commerce, Production, Supply and Distribution) Act, 2003, could be ensured at the Gayeshpur Municipality areas.

Methodology:

- Videos on harmfulness of Tobacco and Enforcement of COTPA, 2003.

Decisions Taken:

1. Chairman of Gayeshpur Municipality assured to display the signages at the public places and at the educational institutes that come under their jurisdiction.
2. The memorandum will be issued in favour of 'Smoke Free Public Place', & 'Tobacco Free Educational Institute to implement the Blue Line Campaign and Red Rose Campaign.
3. After the meeting it was decided to display the signages (Sec 4) at the Municipality Office.
4. Executive Officer has been appointed as Nodal Officer at Gayeshpur Municipality.
5. All elected Councillors and Departmental Heads of Gayeshpur Municipality oath to keep their Municipality Smoke Free.
6. Chairman assured that a consensus decision will be taken in this BOC Meeting regarding issue of separate Tobacco Vendor Trade Licence in line with the order from Urban Development and Municipal Affairs Department.

Feedbacks:

All the Councillors committed that they would take required initiatives to make their jurisdictions smoke free as soon as possible.
